The Pastoral Perspective Administrator's Angle

With Rev. Steve Silver on sabbatical, other FCC staff take turns in this spot...

"Where are you going this year?" That was the question when I told friends I'd be taking another weeklong road trip with my daughter Grace. This is now the fifth summer she and I have done a trip like this, following a new itinerary each time. We describe the trips as "seasons," like for a TV show—Season 5 is a tour of the Berkshires, in western Massachusetts.

Like many people, I'm comfortable in routines. That includes vacations, which I haven't always been good about taking. I know it's healthy to give oneself a break, seek out new experiences and places. Vacations, though, disrupt our routines—indeed, that's often their explicit intent, as if routines were a prison from which we need liberation.

My road trips with Grace have surely been vacations, opportunities to enjoy the relaxed pace of summer and go somewhere we've never been. Each one, however, has happened around the same week in July, on the same five days of the week, covering roughly the same number of miles. We listen to the same Spotify playlist, many (many) hours long. In other words, our vacations have featured a certain consistency and predictability. Routines.

So, am I truly getting a break, a new life experience? Or are my vacations just another set of routines in disguise? Well, in planning each trip, I do take advantage of a proven template that works well, and Grace and I are both happy with it. But for all their consistency, these trips have been delightfully varied and individualized—the template may be the same, but we fill it each year with new roads, towns, landscapes, historical sites, gardens, food, quirky attractions. Each season of our "show" brings similar storylines but new characters, scenes, narratives, plot twists. Even the playlist evolves annually, with some songs removed and many others added.

In my position at FCC, I manage our calendar and publicize events on a schedule that is very consistent from year to year. The seasons come and go, and we rely on repetition, a rhythm from one month to the next. Except for Easter's variable date, the liturgical calendar does not change. Boring? Only if we allow it to be. The challenge, like coming up with new itineraries for my road trips with Grace, is animating that routine calendar with new experiences, unexplored destinations, and fresh energy and perspective.

So where are we going this year?

DIACONATE


Sue Pratt opened June's Diaconate meeting with a devotion and prayer about people near and far coming together and moving forward. She asked that God grant them courage.

There have been several pastoralcare issues in the congregation this summer, including Jeff Williams' illness and the passing of Bruce Laro, whose cremains were interred in the FCC memorial garden on June 19. During Rev. Silver's sabbatical, all congregant concerns are passed on to the Diaconate, with the assistance of the Church Administrator.

Deacons also discussed Community Dinners and coffee hour. With all summer dinners covered, the group considered that a congregationally focused meal could serve as a fundraiser. It was further suggested that the congregation convene to draft a fundraising case statement. Needs include upgrading the kitchen and the Sanctuary sound system. Some also expressed interest in organizing a curated yard sale.





