Our church has been blessed by its mission work in Central America, both in El Salvador and Guatemala. The committee has been especially gratified by the way our relationship has developed with Epilogos and the people of San Jose Villanueva, an effort that culminated in a trip by several church members to El Salvador in 2014. Since that time, though, two developments have occurred that we believe make consideration of a new "farther from home" mission partnership opportune. First, El Salvador is currently plagued by levels of violence last seen during the vicious Civil War of the late 1980s and early 1990s, posing significant danger to those travelling to and working in the country. Sadly, the violence shows no sign of abating and has led Epilogos to curtail some of its activities. Second, but related, Mike and Suzie Jenkins, the on-site coordinators for Epilogos, are retiring in February 2016, ushering in a period of transition for the organization.

Opportunities for new partnerships can be found in the U.S and Central America. Here in the States, we might consider developing a relationship with Back Bay Mission, a United Church of Christ affiliate in Biloxi, Mississippi, that provides services to the poor and marginalized of the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Another path to explore would be doing mission work and developing ties with a Native American community, either on the East Coast or further out west. In Central America, there are a number of possibilities in Guatemala.
